Tools to help you save on energy

Take advantage of programs we offer to reduce your energy usage and save money.

- » FPL Energy Manager: This custom online tool is designed to provide insights into how your home uses energy. You can get expert efficiency tips, monitor your usage with the Energy Dashboard and take a free FPL Energy Survey to receive personalized recommendations to optimize the way you use energy. - » In-Home Energy Evaluation: For an even more tailored experience, an FPL efficiency expert can visit your home to identify potential energy-saving opportunities and recommend improvements that may qualify for rebates. - » Building Energy-efficiency Rating System (BERS) audit: Customers with single-family homes can request a state-certified rater perform an energy inspection and provide BERS Certificate based on Florida Energy Code Whole Building Performance Method A, which enables a customer to compare the efficiency of their home to a comparable baseline. The cost for this service starts at \$75 for a review of plans for a new home and \$480-\$555 for on-site inspections of homes up to 2,000 sq. ft. Additional charges apply for larger homes. Streetlights: what you should know

If you notice a problem, report it at FPL.com/streetlight. Have the following information ready:

- » The streetlight's location or the 11-digit number on the pole.
- » A description of the problem.
- » Your contact information (name, address, email address or phone number).

Not all streetlights are maintained by FPL. We'll let you know if your local municipality or homeowner association is responsible for the light. Also, during sea turtle nesting and hatching season, we intentionally turn off some streetlights to avoid disorienting turtles near the beach.

In compliance with Florida law, we annually publish these procedures for customers and the public to know how to report inoperative or malfunctioning streetlights.

Helpful resources for customers in need

We want to ensure those who need help get assistance. Here are some services available to you:

- » Evacuation assistance: If you have special needs, your local government can help if you ever need to evacuate due to extreme weather or other emergencies. Make sure to register with your local emergency management office by contacting them directly. Just check your phone directory for "county government."
- » Financial assistance available by county: There are community resources available for seniors, low-income customers, and those in crisis situations. To discover what options may be available to you, call the 211 Helpline for confidential community resources. If you or someone in your household is 60 or older, call the Elder Helpline at 1-800-963-5337 for additional assistance.
